SECRETARYS REPORT - 2001

A Chairde Gael,

Cuireann se athas orm an tuarascail seo ar imeachtaí an club i 2001 a chur os bhur gcomhair.

INTRODUCTIONS:

2001 was an amazing year for gaelic games across all areas. There were many memorable and enjoyable matches, and Sligo added to the drama and excitement.

National 2001.

- Padhraic Joyce led Galway to the promised land with a great performance in the second half of the All Ireland Final as he tormented the Meath back line and finished the game with 10pts. Galway won the Sam Maguire for the ninth time.
- The All Ireland Hurling final was a brilliant game and the “Premier County” Tipperary showed remarkable character to record a three point victory and take the “Liam Mc Carthy Cup” against Galway
- The Hoodoo on Mayo football was smashed in resounding fashion in Croke Park on April 17th 2001 when Crossmolina recorded a sensational 0-16 to 1-12 victory over Nemo Rangers in the All Ireland Club football final and won the Andy Merrigan Cup. Athenry retained the Tommy Moore Cup for the third time, in a momentous and truly meritorious victory over Graigue-Ballycallan of Kilkenny.
- Tyrone won the All Ireland Minor Final after a replay against Dublin. Cork won the Hurling minor All-Ireland against Galway.
- St. Patricks Navan won the All Ireland football Colleges Final(Hogan Cup) against St. Jarleths Tuam, and St Colmans Fermoy won the senior Hurling Colleges final against Gort C.C. Galway.
- Laois won their first ever All- Ireland Senior Ladies football title in sensational and dramatic fashion against holders and favourites Mayo.

Provincial 2001.

- Mayo won the Allianz National League Final for the first time since 1970 in a thrilling game in Croke Park against near neighbours Galway.
- Roscommon won the Connaught Senior football final (Nestor Cup) in dramatic fashion against Mayo.
- Mayo won the Connaught Minor and U21 Titles.
- Roscommon Junior Ladies won the All Ireland Final against Kildare.

County 2001.

- Sligo were a breath of fresh air to this years new-look Bank of Ireland football championship. They recovered from the heart break of a one point defeat to Mayo in the Connaught Championship to take the scalps of Carlow and , more memorably Kildare, before succumbing to a breathtaking Dublin performance a round short of the All-Ireland quarter finals.
- Sligo reached the Semi-final of the Allianz National League for the first time in 27 years and put up a very good performance against Galway on a wet April’s evening in Dr. Hyde Park. Paul Taylor was top scorer in the National League with 1-42.

- Eamonn O’Hara was selected on the Irish Gaelic football team which won the International Series against Australia down in Australia. He was also nominated for an All-Star.

Club 2001.

There were a number of ground breaking and history making achievements in the club:-

- The girls won the first ever ladies title for the club-the U14 B County League.
- The Club competed in the Senior Hurling League and Championship for the first time in Club history and captured the Dermot Molloy League
- The U12 team won the league & championship for the second year in a row.
- St. Patricks N.S. Calry won the Sligo County Mini-sevens in hurling and football for the second year in a row.
- The U16 team won the League County Final for the second year in a row.
- The U14 Hurling team represented Sligo in the Feile.
- Coaching of football(boys & girls) and hurling was carried out by a number of dedicated and committed people to whom we should be very grateful.
- Diane O’Hora and Padraig Joyce presented medals to underage winning teams.

INTERMEDIATE TEAM:

League 2001: This level consisted of the following teams: Grange, Enniscrone, St. Michaels, St Pats, Mullinabreena, Geevagh, St. Farnans, Ballisodare and Calry St. Josephs, St Marys, Ballymote, Cloonnacool. There were a number of strong, well prepared teams in this group. The team finished with only two wins and one draw.

Championship: Grange and Geevagh were in our group. We were reliant on a number of Minor players to make up the numbers for the Championship. Even though we were beaten in the two games it showed that we have some exceptional talent among our panel.

The current crisis at intermediate level as highlighted by Gerry Higgins needs to be addressed soon.

JUNIOR:

A junior team was fielded during the year which was a great opportunity for some of the younger players in the Club to play at the adult levels. The team had a good win over Shamrock Gaels but failed to qualify for the knockout stages of competitions. The team were beaten by Coolera in the Championship. (Appendix 2)

SENIOR HURLING

2001 was a historic year since the Club fielded their first Senior Hurling Team. This team is a result of many years of hard work carried out at underage level. Thanks are also due to a number of former Craobh Rua players who have helped steer the Club to its first Senior League title only months after it was formed.

The team were unlucky to not qualify for the Championship final after a gruelling game against Tourlestrane. As pointed out by the Hurling report a higher standard of refereeing needs to be achieved. (Appendix 3).

U21 TEAM:

We failed to field a team in this competition for 2001.

U-18 TEAM:

The team competed in the Minor "A" League and Championship. This was one of the more successful Minor teams of recent times. They achieved major success by making it to the Minor league final only losing marginally to St. Johns in a thrilling game. The team advanced to the quarter finals of the championship and were narrowly beaten by Curry in Hazelwood.

The small number of teams in the A League poses problems for real development of talented minors in Sligo. (Appendix 4)

U-17 WINTER LEAGUE TEAM:

This was the first time in a number of years that the Minor Bord ran a winter league. Even though the only points gained in this league were for a walkover against St Marys it gave an opportunity for boys to play Gaelic Football and keep in touch with the skills which will hopefully raise the standards for 2002. (Appendix 5)

U-16 TEAM:

The team competed in the U-16 "A" League and Championship with Ballymote , Drumcliffe and Coolera. This was a very small group of teams which does not help much in the development of Gaelic football. There needs to be at least eight teams in each section. The team was very well coached and trained and they won the U-16 "A" League against Tourlestrane. Unfortunately it was Tourlestrane who then knocked The U-16 team out of the Championship. (Appendix 6)

U-15 WINTER LEAGUE TEAM

This team made the most of the winter football competition by winning two of their games and only losing one. The prospects for the 2002 U-16 team look very positive. (Appendix 7)

U-14 TEAM:

The team competed in the U-14 "A" League and Championship with Enniscrone, Eastern Harps, Curry and St Johns who were to beat them in the league semi-final. This competition had a very small group of teams. This level of participation is inadequate for the optimum Gaelic football skill development. The team was beaten by Curry in the second round of the championship (Appendix 8)

U-12 TEAM:

The team competed in the U-12 "A" League and Championship with St. Johns, St. Marys, Coolera, Shamrock Gaels, Drumcliffe, Tourlestrane and Eastern Harps. This is a very skilful team who were very focused. It's a great achievement to retain both League & Championship for a second successive year (Appendix 9)

U-11 TEAM:

The team competed in the Sligo City Board League with St. Johns, St. Marys, Coolera and Drumcliffe/Rosses Point. This is also a very competent and committed group of players and the level of composure shown and the sheer class exhibited in all their games made them very worthy winners of the City League. (Appendix 10)

U-10 COMMUNITY GAMES (BOYS & GIRLS):

Calrys U-10 team were unlucky to lose against St. Feichins in Hazelwood. Much preparation was done for this game with 3 challenge games in advance. They have enormous potential if they continue to play and train. (Appendix 11)

U-9 TEAM:

This team competed in the Sligo City Board. The team gained worthwhile experience in this competition and their skill and workrate was admirable in all their matches. (Appendix 12)

JUVENILE HURLING:

There is tremendous work being done by a few very dedicated people in the promotion of Hurling. This enormous effort was rewarded with success at U-12 County Championship and the U-14 team qualified for Feile and represented Sligo in the Hurling Feile finals in Cobh. The fruits of this effort is evident at the number of young club hurlers representing Sligo on County underage and Senior teams. (Appendix 13)

LADIES FOOTBALL:

The standard of Ladies football is continuing to improve with increased numbers participating and the skill level rising. There was great success at U-14 League level and teams took part in County Competitions at U-12 and Community Games. Diane O'Hora came to the Marian Hall to present the medals to the successful U-14 Team. (Appendix 14)

COACHING:

Coaching in the club continued apace during the year in football and hurling (boys and girls).

- On every Saturday morning - March to October from 11.00a.m. to 12.30p.m. for 6 - 12 year old boys and girls.
- Ladies football coaching twice a week from April to September.

- Underage Hurling training all year round - outdoor and indoor.
- City Board Summer coaching two sessions of two hours duration for eight weeks
- Gaelic Summer Camp for 7 - 14 year olds, boys and girls for five days at the start of August provided by the County Development Coaching Committee
- National schools through their involvement in Cumann na mBunscoil competitions, hurling, football and camogie.
- Second level schools.
- All the team managers organised their own team coaching.
- The County school of excellence and Development squads provided another high level of coaching for selected club players.
- There are also coaching courses provided by the County Coaching Development Committee to interested club members.

There are great opportunities for all interested in Gaelic games to develop their skills, provided through the Club.

SLIGO I.T.:

Sligo I.T. continues to work hard to promote Gaelic games at third level and their high rating nationally is shown by their re-selection to host the Sigerson Cup Competition in 2002. Gaelic Games Officer, Michael Harte, and Club Chairperson Michael Breslin and the college staff deserve our thanks for their great work in the promotion of Gaelic games. The best of luck to the Sligo I.T. team and mentors in the Sigerson Cup competition.

SUMMERHILL COLLEGE:

Many of our club players train and play Gaelic games in Summerhill College. The teachers who give of their time to organise the playing of the games deserve our thanks. It is important for the club and club members to help in any way our second level schools in the promotion of Gaelic games.

CUMANN na mBUNSCOIL:

I want to thank Cumann na mBunscoil and especially the coaches of all the National schools within the Clubs area for their dedication, commitment and hard work in preparing and organising school teams (boys and girls) hurling and football for the school leagues. There is tremendous work being done in encouraging the school children to play hurling and football and I would encourage club members and parents to assist the teachers in any positive way at this enormous task. This year I want to especially thank and congratulate Pat Stenson and the Calry N.S. team on winning the Sligo Mini sevens for the second year in a row. This talented team also won the Connaught Mini Sevens and had the honour of having Daniel Dolan play in Croke Park for the All Ireland semi-final and Damien O Boyle for the All-Ireland Final at the Cumann Na mBunscoil exhibition games.

BORD na nOG:

Bord na nOg is a vital organ of the club in the promotion and development of Gaelic games. I want to thank the officers and members of Bord na nOg for their dedication

and hard work during the year. I also want to congratulate them on all the training sessions organised, games played and their success on the field of play (Appendix 15)

SCOR na nOG:

The Club was well represented in two events at the North Board Scor na nOg Finals in Grange in Instrumental Music and Question Time. I want to congratulate all participants and especially the Question Time who qualified for the Connaught Finals. I want to thank John Griffen and Tim Hynes who took it upon themselves to organise teams for participation in Scor. It is important to ensure that the promotion of Irish language and culture are promoted at all levels within the Club. Also sincere thanks to the parents for encouraging their children to participate in Scor na nOg. (Appendix 19)

CLUB MEETINGS

Monthly Club meetings were held throughout the year and were well attended. Representations are needed from all areas of the Club at monthly meetings. To ensure that your views and opinions are listened to please make an effort to attend a few of these meetings during the year. These meetings are held in St. Josephs Church on the Second Monday of every month. (Appendix 30).

MEMBERSHIP

During 2001 we experienced another year in which members had not paid their subscriptions before the due closing date. We would encourage all people to make a special effort to pay their membership as soon as possible and before you or your family attend training or play any Football or Hurling games in 2002. This would make the administrative work in the Club less onerous. Membership must be paid to Loretta Kearins or Pat Branley. Thanks to all managers and coaches who collected membership from players during the year. (Appendix 17)

PITCH USAGE:

The co-ordination of the pitch usage is a very challenging and demanding task with the ever increasing activity. Thanks are due to Joe Keane for all his work during 2001. Could I ask all managers to ensure they liase at an early stage with the Co-ordinator in determining the times and days of training sessions and games. (Appendix 21)

INSURANCE - HEALTH AND SAFETY:

2002 will be the third year for the GAA and Coyle Hamilton to offer a Players Injury Insurance Scheme. This scheme is designed to cover **serious** injury and is well worth considering. We advised all players (Juvenile and adults) to have Health Insurance cover eg. VHI, BUPA etc. before they partake in any sports. It is every individuals responsibility to ensure they have adequate health/injury insurance since injury is an inherent part of sport. Thanks to Eamonn Kelly for organising the subscriptions to the GAA / Coyle Hamilton scheme during 2001.

REFEREES:

The Referee plays a key role on the field of play and must be treated with respect. We should all be prepared to play our part in achieving better quality refereeing by:- changing attitudes towards referees and refereeing; creating the right conditions for referees to carry out their duties; promoting respect for referees and the rules and desisting from abusing referees at all times. The County Board are seeking new referees and I would urge all members to encourage and support any club person who might be interested in taking up refereeing

DUAL PLAYERS

The dual players of Gaelic Football and Hurling should be recognised for their significant contributions to the promotion of Gaelic Games. Well done to all involved and keep up the good work.

FINANCE:

The cost of running a club is continuing to increase. Money is needed to keep the club going, to buy equipment, to cover transport, to maintain the grounds, to pay insurance and in general to service the day-to-day needs of the club. No club should fail or decline or restrict its normal activities for lack of money. I want to sincerely thank Pat Branley for his commitment and hard work as club Treasurer and also Loretta Kearins for her co-operation and help as Assistant Treasurer.

LOTTO & FUNDRAISING

The Club LOTTO is our main source of fund-raising and I want to compliment and thank Pat Branley for his commitment and dedication to his role as Club LOTTO co-ordinator and also to Alo Farragher who plays an important part on the Club LOTTO committee. Thanks to everyone who helped with the transition from Punt to EURO. The last Punt Lotto draw was held on January 15.

As you will see from the Treasurers report there is a deficit for the year of IR£1777. We need to have more members involved with fundraising to ensure we can continue to develop the Club. 2001 was the first year that all Clubs in Sligo were obliged to sell Lotto tickets to help fund the County Board. This will cost our Club in the region of €3,500 in February 2002. We will be selling our own yearly lotto tickets to help offset this cost and we will be asking more members to help support us in this. The tickets will cost in the region of €30 and will ensure your numbers are entered in all Club Lotto draws for one year (17 draws).

Thank you to everyone who helped organise and support all fundraising activities during the year. (Appendix 18)

SPONSORSHIP:

It is true to say that no club can survive without sponsorship and this club is no different. We are always on the look out for sponsorship no matter how small and all sponsorship is very much appreciated and very welcome. I want to take this opportunity to sincerely thank all club sponsors for their contributions during the year

and to assure them that their assistance is put to positive club and games promotion and development.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT:

Early in 2001 a number of Club members attended five meetings in the Sligo IT with the purpose of producing a Club Development Plan. The five meetings which were undertaken proved very constructive. BALLINODE / HAZELWOOD PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

We have made a submission to the County Planner in connection with the proposed residential development of the Ballinode / Hazelwood area. We have stated how we currently have an overused pitch at Hazelwood and how we would need additional space to cater for any proposed increase in residents of the Calry St. Josephs Parish.

DISCIPLINE

The Club has a very good record of Discipline. It is imperative that all members and supporters of our Club ensure they always have respect for fellow players, opposition players, supporters, referees and Club property. In this time of greater accountability Club members we must not bring the name of our Club into disrepute.

- Joe Keane - Secretary of Sligo County Hurling Juvenile Board who is promoting Hurling with enthusiasm, drive and proficiency.

- Dorothy McConnon - Sligo County Lotto Co-ordinator, who does her job efficiently, competently and with enthusiasm.

COUNTY PLAYER REPRESENTATION:

It is very heartening and encouraging to see the number of club players who wear the County jersey at different age levels in Hurling and Football increasing every year. This is surely a testament to the diligent, dedicated and committed coaching being carried out by many people down through the years and finally due to the support and encouragement of the parents. I wish to thank all the coaches, players and parents who are making the wearing of the "Black and White" a reality and long may it continue.

ALL IRELAND GAELIC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT.

2001 saw the introduction of a new County Gaelic football championship. The new format meant that every County Team could lose one match up to and including the Provincial Finals. The championship ran over 63 games and attracted total attendances of 1,208,651 proving that it was a winner from a viewing perspective. Sligo's exciting adventure, which took in four championship games but no titles gave the new format a massive PR boost and took Sligo to two great games in Croke Park, beating Kildare in a very exciting game and losing to Dublin. Galway used the new system to their advantage by being the first team to win the Sam Maguire by losing a match on route.

NATIONAL LEAGUE FORMAT

The Inter county football League is now being played in one calendar year starting on Feb 2nd 2002. It remains to be seen if the new format will eventually prove a step in the right direction. What is clear is that the plan will result in a spring time of non stop action with the Div 1 & Div 2 Finals down for April 28th 2002. A three month programme that will see counties in action on three consecutive weeks in February.

FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE

The FMD curtailed all sporting activities during March and April. There had been an outbreak in Tyrone and exclusion Zones were set up. All sporting, social and community events were stopped and even St. Patrick Day Parades were called off. Clubs were asked to disinfect entrances to their premises. All the stops were pulled out to try and ensure that the disease could be contained. The sacrifices made by everyone were successful in containing the disease and on the first week of April the National Leagues resumed. However Tyrone and Louth were not allowed to complete their League programme.

TRAGEDY IN SEPTEMBER

The date September 11th 2001 will be etched in the human psyche for a long time to come. It was the day that changed the world. Two aircraft crashed into the Twin Towers in Manhattan, a third plunged into the Pentagon and a fourth crashed in Pennsylvania. This was a most horrific and terrible tragedy and an estimated four thousand people lost their lives. Many Irish people perished in this tragedy. Kieran Gorman from Mullinabreena tragically lost his life. He played football for his club and County Sligo before he immigrated to America. His friends in Mullinabreena have set up a very worthy and deserving fund for his wife and family and this should be fully supported. Any contribution should be made to the **Gorman Family Benefit Fund** and forward to Peadar Conway, Cloondrihara, Lavagh, Tubbercurry, Co. Sligo.

RULE 21 CHANGE

At a Special Congress in November 2001 the GAA voted to delete Rule 21 from the Rule Book. The rule stated "Members of the British armed forces and Police shall not be eligible for membership of the Association. A member of the Association participating in dances, or similar entertainment, promoted by or under the patronage of such bodies, shall incur suspension of at least three months". The social and political conditions in the North of Ireland are continuing to improve and this gesture by the Association should help further improve conditions.

CROKE PARK'S CHANGING FACE

The day after Derry won the All Ireland in 1993, the heavy machinery moved in and started to remove the old Cusack Stand. The Canal End was next to go and was demolished after the 1998 All Ireland Finals. This phase is now complete. The Hogan Stand was taken down in October 1999 and is currently nearing completion. It was the beginning of a complete makeover which is still ongoing and will transform GAA Head Quarters into a phenomenal stadium.

On its completion, Croke Park will be one of the finest stadia not just in Europe but any where in the world, with a capacity of 80,000. The new-look Croke Park represents a new era in spectator comfort –not to mention playing facilities.

AIB GAA CLUB WINNERS 2000

The Club was presented with the "AIB GAA County Club of the Year 2000 Award" at a very enjoyable ceremony in Croke Park on 29th January 2001. Hugh Mc Loughlin's last official function as Chairman was to accept the Award and Development Grant from GAA President Sean Mc'Cague on behalf of the club. The Clubs were assessed under a number of key headings:-Coaching,-structures,-promotion of gaelic games,-participation of club officials in Comhairle. Club member Fr. Liam Devine represented the Sligo County Board and County Board Treasurer Seamus Cronin represented the A.I B. Sligo. This was a great achievement for the club, and it was with great honour and pride that Hugh accepted this prestigious award on behalf of all the committed and dedicated people who have helped in the clubs development since its foundation in 1972. Unfortunately we did not retain this title for 2001. Congratulations to St. Marys on receiving this for 2001.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

There were a number of social activities held in 2001. Many thanks to all the organisers and people who supported these events.

The Year 2001 would rate among the most successful year for Juvenile Hurling in the Calry/St. Josephs Club>>> we played a leading role in all Underage Fixtures from Under-8 right up to Minor, & a number of the young lads who came up through the Juvenile ranks, made huge impressions on the County Senior Hurling scene, both on the Sligo Senior Hurling team & also for Calry/St. Josephs Seniors in their first year in existence.

Indoor Hurling : - Indoor hurling continued every Tuesday night in the Tennis Club from the middle of January until the end of March. Calry/St. Josephs participated in only two of the County indoor competitions (U-9 & U-11),& put up great performances in both. We decided to continue our experiment of deviating from the normal Indoor Hurling Rules, & players were permitted to lift the sliothar into their hand & strike from the hand.....this certainly has sharpened the lads for the early months of Outdoor. Also, instead of participating in the other County competitions at Indoor, we ran our own League of 5-a-side, for the Matt Gilsenan Memorial Trophy, in honour of his tremendous work at all aspects of Underage. This proved this year to be a revelation, & the Final in the I.T. Hall proved to be a cracker, with Ronan Cox overcoming Keith Raymond by the odd goal in 15, after extra-time.

Feile na nGael : - Our young hurlers went outdoors from the end of March every Tuesday and Thursday from 5.30 to 6.30. We won out the County Feile na nGael competition by defeating Western Gaels in the Quarter-Final, Coolera in the Semi-Final, & Tubbercurry quite easily in the Final. Due to the Foot & Mouth Disease, Feile na nGael was originally cancelled, but Cork Coiste na nOg stepped in to host this competition in a very short space of time. Thus began a few hectic weeks of activity of Fund-raising etc., & a lot of credit must go to everyone who helped to ensure that our Trip to Feile would be a memorable one. We were Guests of the COBH Club, & they constantly put themselves out of their way to ensure our visit would be a memorable one. 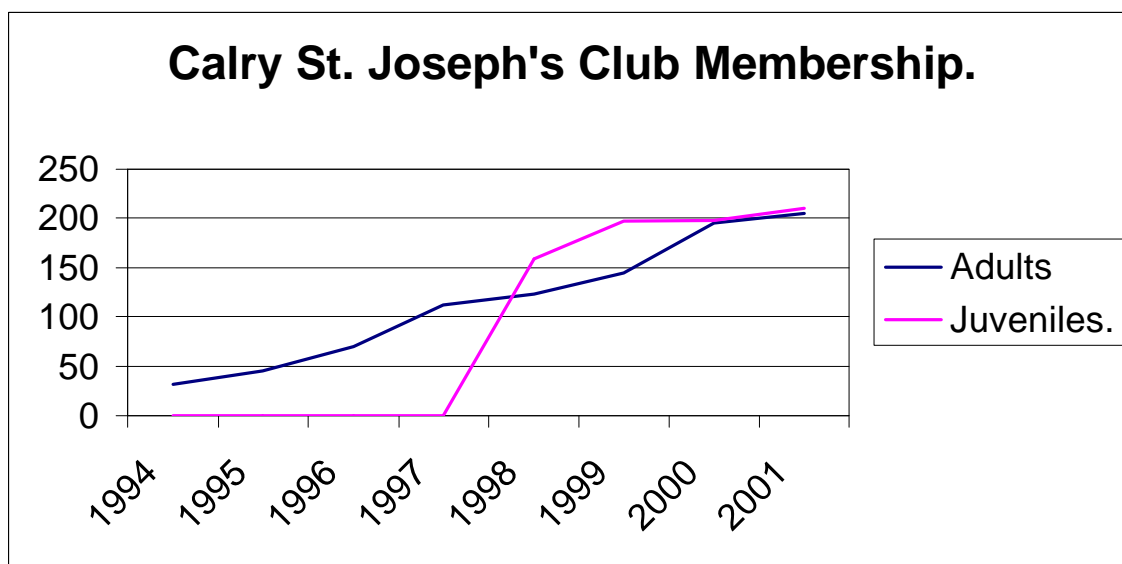
It is vitally important that all personnel involved in Club Administration , Coaching, Managing, Playing Hurling or Football must be a paid up member **before** they participate in any of these activities.

During his term as Chairman he welcomed two GAA Presidents to the Club –Mr Jack Bootman and Mr Joe Mc Donagh.

He received the Sligo Club person of the year award in 1998.

He led and guided the club through enormous success in the development and promotion of gaelic games. He also was a very generous sponsor of the club and a great fundraiser. He initiated the club Lotto which has put the club on a good financial footing.

It was fitting that one of his last official functions as Chairman was to receive the ‘‘A.I B Sligo Club of the Year 200 Award’’ from a third GAA President –Mr Sean Mc’Cague at a very enjoyable function in Croke Park in February 2001..

Hugh’s contribution to the development and promotion of gaelic games in the Calry St. Josephs Parish is enormous and the energy and time he expended is unmeasurable.

Hugh surely epitomises the voluntary GAA/ parish/community worker who carries out his work for the betterment of the community.

We wish Hugh, Nancy and family many years of health and happiness in the future and we will always be assured of Hugh and Nancy’s continued help and support in the ongoing work of club development.
