## **STANDING ORDERS**

- (1) Those entitled to vote at the AGM are the officers and members of the Club for 2002.
- (2) Voting shall be by a show of hands or by secret ballot at the discretion of such registered full members. The quota for election is the next highest number of the total number of votes divided by the number of vacancies plus one. In the cases of one vacancy to be filled on the single votes of 90 full members, the quota would be 46.
- (3) All motions must be formally proposed and seconded.
- (4) The proposer of the motion must do so in less than three minutes but will have the right of reply for two minutes at the end of the discussion.
- (5) No member other than the proposer may speak more than once on any motion.
- (6) All speakers, other than the proposer of a motion, must limit themselves to two minutes.
- (7) Members are requested to sign in on entering the AGM hall.

## SECRETARYS REPORT - 2002

### *A Chairde Gael,*

Cuireann se athas orm an tuarascail seo ar imeachtaí an club i 2002 a chur os bhur gcomhair.

### INTRODUCTIONS:

2002 was an amazing year for gaelic games across all areas. There were many memorable and enjoyable matches, and Sligo added to the drama and excitement.

#### National 2002.

- Kieran Mc Geeney made history by leading Armagh to the promised land after taking two games to overcome brilliant Sligo performances in the quarter final, and lifted the 'Sam Maguire' for the first time in a most absorbing, sporting and exciting Final against the Kingdom of Kerry.
- Kilkenny won their 27<sup>th</sup> All-Ireland senior Hurling title with great style against the might of the Banner County(Clare) and lifted the 'Liam Mc Carthy Cup'.
- Ballinderry(Derry) claimed the 'Andy Merrigan Cup' at their first attempt when they beat Nemo Rangers in the AIB All-Ireland Club Football Final at Semple Stadium. Birr were crowned AIB hurling Hurling Champions for the third time against Clarinbridge(Galway) and lifted the 'Tommy Moore Cup'.
- Derry won the Minor All-Ireland football Final against Meath and Kilkenny won the Minor All-Ireland Hurling against Galway.
- Sligo I.T. won the coveted 'Sigerson Cup' for the first time ever against U.C.C. in a wet and windy Marchievicz Park.
- St. Jarleths won the 'Hogan Cup' against St Michaels of Enniskillen and St Colmans, Fermoy won the Hurling Snr Colleges against St. Kierans Kilkenny.
- **Provincial 2002.**
- Galway won the Connaught Senior title(Nestor Cup) against Sligo and Galway also won the Connaught Minor and U-21 Titles against Leitrim and Mayo respectively and went on to win the All Ireland U-21 Title against Dublin.
- Mayo Senior ladies won the All-Ireland Final(Brendan Martin Cup) for the third time against Monaghan and Galway Junior Ladies won the All-Ireland title(West county Hotel Cup) against Donegal.
- Charlestown won the Connaught Senior Club football final for 2001 and Crossmolina have won the 2002 Final.

#### County 2002.

- On the 4<sup>th</sup> August in Croke Park Sligo played Armagh in the All-Ireland Football quarter Finals in a game which was one of the best of the Championship and one which Sligo deserved to win. Down to fourteen men and trailing by five points with thirteen minutes remaining the Sligo Team played inspired football to snatch a draw in the last minute. The replay in Navan was equally exciting as Sligo fans watched their heroes chip away at a seven point deficit, reducing it to two with time nearly up. Then Sean Davey had a penalty claim turned down and Armagh marched on to win the All-Ireland by beating Dublin and then Kerry in the Final.
- Eamonn O'Hara did the County proud by winning a deserved Vodafone Football All-Star at centre forward and he also played in the Irish team against the Aussies in the International Rules series. Dessy Sloyne won the Highest scorer Award in Connaught Championship.
- Sligo U-16 Hurlers reached the All-Ireland C Championship Final and were narrowly beaten by Monaghan in Enniskillen.

#### CLUB 2002

There were a number of ground breaking and history making achievements in the club:-

- The girls continued where they left off in 2001 and won three County Titles at underage level.
- The senior hurlers reached the Senior County Championship Hurling Final and were beaten by Tubbercurry.

- Coaching of football (boys & girls) and hurling was carried out by a number of dedicated and committed people to whom we should be very grateful.
- "Coaching on the green" commenced in Cartron and was well attended with enthusiastic boys and girls.

### **INTERMEDIATE TEAM:**

**League 2002:** There were a number of strong, well prepared teams in this group. The team competed well winning 5 games.

**Championship:** St Pats and St Farnans were in our group. As in 2001 we were beaten in both games. Towards the latter end of the campaign the panel was depleted through injuries. (Appendix 1)

### **JUNIOR:**

A junior team was fielded during the year which was a great opportunity for some of the younger players in the Club to play at the adult levels. The team had a good winning record in the league winning their two games but due to the inclement weather this competition was not concluded. The team was narrowly beaten in the Championship by Ballysadare. (Appendix 2)

### **SENIOR HURLING**

2002 was another successful year for the senior hurlers having reached the final of 4 competitions which they entered. Three of these have yet to be played due to a number of reasons. (Appendix 3).

### **U21 TEAM:**

Despite the interests of a number of enthusiastic U-21 players we failed to get a commitment from enough players to enter a team in this competition.

### **U-18 TEAM:**

2002 was a very sad year for the Club minors due to the tragic passing of Paul Ducie who was a player on the team. Paul was sadly missed by all his team mates and mentors. We would like to express our sincere condolences to the Ducie family.

The minor team only won one game during their league and championship campaign. (Appendix 4)

### **U-16 TEAM:**

The team competed in the U-16 "A" League and Championship. Despite poor numbers attending training this team progressed to the championship semi-final. (Appendix 5)

### **U-14 TEAM:**

The team competed in the U-14 "A" League and progressed to the Feile league final but were beaten both times by a much more physical St Marys team. (Appendix 6)

### **U-12 TEAM:**

The team competed in the U-12 "A" League and Championship. Many of the previous years U-12 team were still eligible to play at U-12 in 2002. However success was not to be having been beaten by Enniscrone in the league final. (Appendix 7)

### **U-11 TEAM:**

The team competed admirably in the Sligo City Board. Despite a number of close games the team were defeated narrowly on each occasion. (Appendix 8)

## **U-10 COMMUNITY GAMES ( BOYS & GIRLS):**

Calrys U-10 team won this competition beating Coolera. They then represented Sligo but were beaten by a strong Roscommon side. Well done to all involved. (Appendix 9)

## **U-9 TEAM:**

This team competed in the Sligo City Board. The team gained worthwhile experience in this competition and their skill and workrate was admirable in all their matches. (Appendix 10)

## **JUVENILE HURLING:**

There is tremendous work being done by a few very dedicated people in the promotion of Hurling. This enormous effort was rewarded with success at U-16, defeated in the final at U-12. Regretably no team was entered at U-14 due to lack of commitment by the players.

## **LADIES FOOTBALL:**

Well done to all involved with ladies footballers having won the treble at U-12 in Community Games, League and Championship. The standard of Ladies football is continuing to improve with increased numbers participating and the skill level rising. Ladies U-14 and U-16 were not as fortunate been beaten by some clubs with established senior ladies teams. (Appendix 11)

## **BORD na nOG:**

Bord na nOg is a vital organ of the club in the promotion and development of Gaelic games. I want to thank the officers and members of Bord na nOg for their dedication and hard work during the year. I also want to congratulate them on all the training sessions organised, games played and their success on the field of play.

## **COACHING:**

Coaching in the club continued apace during the year in football and hurling (boys and girls).

- On every Saturday morning - March to October from 11.00a.m. to 12.30p.m. for 6 - 12 year old boys and girls.
- Ladies football coaching twice a week from April to September.
- Underage Hurling training all year round - outdoor and indoor.
- City Board Summer coaching two sessions of two hours duration for eight weeks
- Gaelic Summer Camp for 7 - 14 year olds, boys and girls for five days at the start of August provided by the County Development Coaching Committee
- National schools through their involvement in Cumann na mBunscoil competitions, hurling, football and camogie.
- Second level schools.
- All the team managers organised their own team coaching.
- The County school of excellence and Development squads provided another high level of coaching for selected club players.
- Congratulations to Calry NS and principal Pat Stenson on receiving a Cathaoirleachs Award in the Sport Category for the Schools tremendous efforts in promoting Gaelic Games.
- Congratulations to Benny O'Reilly, Gary Dillon, Vincent Nally who received their Foundation Level Coaching from President Elect Sean Kelly. Also well done to all currently undertaking the Level 1 Coaching Course- Deirdre Quinn, John O'Donnell, Michael Regan, Damien Gannon, Benny O'Reilly, Vincent Nally, Gary Dillon.

There are great opportunities for all interested in Gaelic games to develop their skills, provided through the Club.

## **COACHING ON THE GREEN**

Coaching on the Green commenced in Cartron in September 02 and continued into November. Up to fifty children(boys & girls) took part in the Coaching sessions. The delight in children's faces when Eamonn O'Hara was present was a joy to behold. Thanks to all who helped out at the Coaching and made the initiative such a success. It is hoped to start Coaching in the Ballytivnan/Woodlands area in 2003. The Coaching takes a lot of time and effort and the more people involved helps keep the spirits up and makes the exercise more enjoyable. The time and effort spent coaching can only have a positive and uplifting experience for the children.(Appendix-12)

## **UNDERAGE STRATEGIC PLAN**

The underage Strategic Plan is a National Coaching Template that has been developed by GAA Head of Games Pat Daly, in conjunction with the National Coaching and Games Development Committee to develop our National Games into the New Millennium. The objectives are to maximise participation and maintain optimum playing standards. The Plan will be jointly funded by the GAA Units:, National, Provincial, County and Club. The Club will have the responsibility to provide certified Coaches to help run initiatives alongside Teachers and Games Promotion Officers(GPO). The Irish Sports Council and the Sports Council of Northern Ireland are partners in this venture, and the plan is being jointly funded through equipment, gear and grants. There are many initiatives through which the plan can be progressed:-Coaching sessions, skills awards, club mini leagues, Inter club blitzes and many more. We are pleased that Eamonn O'Hara has been appointed as GPO to the Sligo City Board and wish him well in his new role. John Tobin has also been appointed as GPO for Connaught. This is a tremendous investment by the GAA and The Sports Council to promote our National Games and as a club we have a key role to play.

## **STRATEGIC REVIEW**

The Strategic Review of the GAA was a recognition that there has been huge social, economic and demographic changes that required self examination and critical analysis. It is also intended to assist in consolidating the GAA's position in society and continuing the development and evolution as the primary sporting and cultural organisation meeting the needs of the community.

The Strategy Review was put before a Special congress on 25/26<sup>th</sup> October 02 with over 300 motions to be discussed. After much discussion there were just a few Motions passed.:=1. All Players under 16 to be prevented from playing at more than one grade above their own level. 2. All underage club competitions, up to and including minor, be played to a conclusion by using mandatory extra time. County Finals to be excluded. 3. An official two month closed season to be observed. 4. Umpires and linesmen to have more authority to highlight incidents of foul and dangerous play, with slight modifications to ensure the referee retains ultimate authority. 5. The feigning of injuries or fouls to be made a cautionable offence. 6. The adoption of Code of Conduct for members in relation to Child Protection.. 7. Limit of five years on all Officers. 7. Senior inter County Panels to be increased to thirty. There are many more useful and innovative ideas in the Strategy to guide the Association forward.

## **U-17 DIVISIONAL TEAMS**

There was an U-17 Inter Divisional League competition set up by the County Development Committee along with Club representatives. This competition is to give meaningful games to interested players and help to bring them closer to County standard. There are plans to further expand the Inter Divisional Competitions to U-15 and more. This activity will give a more meaningful and positive role to the Divisional Boards whose functions had been reduced drastically. I want to thank Club Member Declan Caslin and his Company for sponsoring this Competition.

## **URBAN DEVELOPMENT**

As a result of a Project submitted by the Sligo City Board to Croke Park there has been a very successful outcome in the appointment of Eamonn O'Hara –Sligo Footballer and Vodofone All Star 2002-as full time Games Promotion Officer for Sligo City and environs. His main role is to co-ordinate, set up and monitor Coaching initiatives in Clubs, National Schools and Second Level Schools. The Club is also a partner in this Football Development and has a key role to play in providing coaches and referees to help out with the increasing number of boys and girls participating in gaelic games. Coaching on the Green in Cartron was set up under this initiative.

## **SLIGO I.T.:**

Sligo I.T. continues to work hard to promote Gaelic games at third level. Well done to all involved in winning the Sigerson Cup in 2002. Gaelic Games Officer, Michael Harte, and Club Chairperson Michael Breslin and the college staff deserve our thanks for their great work in the promotion of Gaelic games.

## **SIGERSON CUP**

Sligo I.T. had to cope with all sorts of obstacles over the last two years, and when the Competition finally came to them, they coped very well and it ran off very smoothly in Sligo. Liam Heekin, a club member was Chairman of the Organising Committee and he left no stone unturned in his efforts to organise this major event. Liam has earned praise for the success of the First Sigerson Final ever staged by Sligo I.T. It was as close to a fairy tale ending as could have been realised. By making it to the Final, Sligo I.T. attracted a sizeable crowd and secured victory by the narrowest of margins against U.C.C in Marchievicz Park. The Cup was presented to Sligo Captain Aidan Higgins and the Charlestown defender also received the 'Man of the Match Award'. Thanks to all who made this National event such a success.

## **SUMMERHILL COLLEGE**

Many of our club players train and play Gaelic games in Summerhill College. The teachers who give of their time to organise the playing of the games deserve our thanks. It is important for the club and club members to help in any way our second level schools in the promotion of Gaelic games.

## **CUMANN na mBUNSCOIL:**

This years I.N.T.O. GAA Mini-Sevens proved once again that the standard of girls gaelic football in the Country's Primary Schools continues to rise. Amazing progress has been made in a short number of years. It is surely just a matter of time before many more Counties make the break through at Senior level. We must acknowledge the tremendous work being done by Primary Teachers through out the Country. It is particularly pleasing that boys and girls now participate in Gaelic Games on an equal basis. Thousands more girls are playing this great game in Schools and Clubs around the Country. Finally I want to thank Cumann na mBunscoil and especially the teachers in our local National Schools for their dedication, commitment and hard work in preparing and organising School Teams, boys and girls, hurling and football for the Cumann na mBunscoil competitions.

I want to thank Cumann na mBunscoil and especially the coaches of all the National schools within the Clubs area for their dedication, commitment and hard work in preparing and organising school teams (boys and girls) hurling and football for the school leagues. There is tremendous work being done in encouraging the school children to play hurling and football and I would encourage club members and parents to assist the teachers in any positive way at this enormous task.

## **INTERNATIONAL RULES SERIOUS 2002**

The Irish Gaelic Football Team played the Aussies in the two-legged International Rules Series on 13/20<sup>th</sup> Oct 02. Eamonn O'Hara played his part majestically. The Irish Team could not respond to a blistering ten-minute scoring spree by the Australians in the final quarter, and this was enough to secure victory for the visitors in the 'International Rules' series at a rain soaked Croke Park in front of 71,000 spectators.

## **CLUB MEETINGS**

We would encourage more members to attend the monthly Club meetings which are held throughout the year. Representations are needed from all areas of the Club at monthly meetings. To ensure that your views and opinions are listened to please make an effort to attend a few of these meetings during the year. ### **Park Development in Sligo City.**

Sligo Borough Council is making great progress on the development of Kevinsfort Recreation area which will consist, among other amenities, of a full size sand carpet grass GAA Pitch and is due to come into operation in 2004. The Borough Council also have plans, subject to funding, to progress with Park Development work at Forthill and Clevereagh in the future. As a Club which requires more ground we need to make adequate representation and application for shared use in any Park Development within the Club area.

The Referee plays a key role on the field of play and must be treated with respect. We should all be prepared to play our part in achieving better quality refereeing by:- changing attitudes towards referees and refereeing; creating the right conditions for referees to carry out their duties; promoting respect for referees and the rules and desisting from abusing referees at all times. The County Board are seeking new referees and I would urge all members to encourage and support any club person who might be interested in taking up refereeing

### **Intermediate Team note (By Eamonn Kelly)**

This was not a year of great success on the playing front for the intermediate team yet there were a number of encouraging points. Ultimately it was disappointing and frustrating season for the team. Again the annual problems of attendance at training and lack of commitment from players were central features of the season. It has to be recognised that the players must accept the brunt of responsibility for the outcomes of 2002.

#### **Positive Aspects**

The commencement of indoor training on Fridays was an excellent idea. These sessions were well attended and provided an opportunity for basic fitness work and team building.

There were a number of promising league displays and results including wins over Mullinabreena, Eastern Harps and St. Marys.

The age profile of the Intermediate team is very young and these players gained valuable championship experience in 2002.

The general improvement in team discipline which had been in decline for a number of years.

### **Recommendations for 2003 Training**

The Intermediate panel should resume indoor training at least four weeks before the start of the 2003 season. There is a need to ensure that adequate training facilities are available, including times when weather is poor. Match quality footballs must be provided

#### **Matches**

It is important that the team plays a match a week, particularly in summer

The issue of umpires and linesmen needs to be looked at by the club. Regularly there are no club members other than players or management to fulfil these roles, this does not reflect well on the club and is demoralising for players

#### **General**

The U-21 championship had in previous years provided a very useful stepping stone for young players to progress to the intermediate team. A team has not been fielded in this grade for a number of years which is disappointing.

#### **Conclusion**

The Intermediate team has not performed well over the past number of years. However we are part of a club that has numerous committed and knowledgeable football people. The team seems to have lost much of the contact that the club used to have with these people. There is a sense that members have lost confidence in the team. The positive outcomes of the year must be built upon if progress is to be made. A healthy intermediate team would be a major help in keeping juvenile players involved with the club as there seems to be a fall off in interest as juveniles get older.

The team must now look forward to 2003. The club must make the future of its adult teams – U-21 and intermediate a priority. This needs to start by deciding at the earliest possible date the structures around these teams.

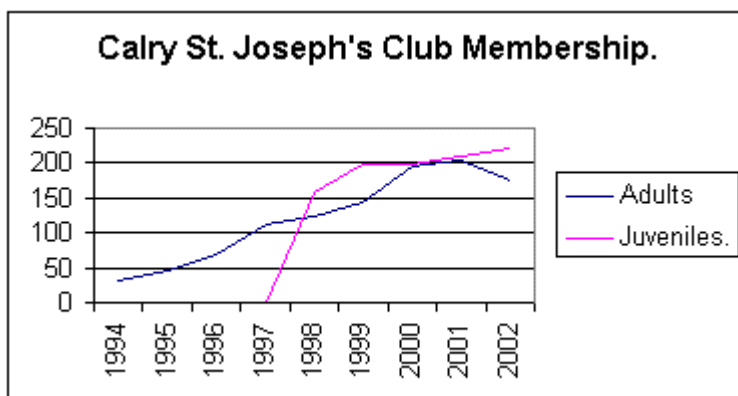
