- (2) Voting shall be by a show of hands or by secret ballot at the discretion of such registered full members. The quota for election is the next highest number of the total number of votes divided by the number of vacancies plus one. In the cases of one vacancy to be filled on the single votes of 90 full members, the quota would be 46.
- (3) All motions must be formally proposed and seconded.
- (4) The proposer of the motion must do so in less than three minutes but will have the right of reply for two minutes at the end of the discussion.
- (5) No member other than the proposer may speak more than once on any motion.
- (6) All speakers, other than the proposer of a motion, must limit themselves to two minutes.
- (7) Members are requested to sign in on entering the AGM hall.

SECRETARYS REPORT - 2005

Club 2005.

- ◆ Pride of place for 2005 goes to the Clubs Senior Hurling Team and management who won the first ever County SHC Final. They advanced to the Connacht Semi-Final where, with an under strength team lost to St Marys of Ck-on Shannon. The team also won the Dermot Molloy Cup –League title against Tourlestrane.
- ◆ The U-21 Football team contested the County ‘A’ semi - final against eventual winners Curry in a great game in Curry.
- ◆ The senior footballers topped their Championship group and reached the County Championship quarter final, where they put in a tremendous effort, but could not match the experience of Curry.
- ◆ The Intermediate footballers won the County League final against St Farnans and have secured Senior league status for 2006. They also won the Benson Cup for the first time ever, and the Junior team won the North Div Jun Championship against St Molaise Gaels.
- ◆ Ladies U-14 team won the league. Well done to all involved.
- ◆ Michael Gilmartin represented Ireland on the U-21 Shinty Team that took part in the International against Scotland.
- ◆ Mairead Gonley was elected on to the Sligo GAA County Board as the Irish & Cultural Officer, and has made history by being the first woman ever on the Board. She is also Secretary of the Sligo Ladies Board.
- ◆ Coaching of football (boys & girls) and hurling was carried out by a number of dedicated and committed people to whom we should be very grateful.

National 2005.

- ◆ Tyrone (O’Neills County) won their second All- Ireland (Sam Maguire) in three seasons, in a truly absorbing final against Kerry which lived up to the highest expectations in a competitive sense. Tyrone also became the first team to win ‘Sam Maguire Cup’ after playing 10 games. Armagh made history when beating Wexford to capture their first National Football League Div 1 title.
- ◆ Cork won the Guinness All Ireland Senior Hurling Championship (Liam Mc Carthy Cup) for the 30th time and second in a row, when their superior talent and awesome power proved too much for Galway to handle. Kilkenny captured the National Hurling League title in impressive fashion against the ‘Banner County’ Clare.
- ◆ Ballina Stephenites scaled the summit of Club achievement on St Patricks Day 05 and claimed the ‘Andy Merrigan Cup’ in an unforgettable breakthrough, in the All Ireland Senior Club Championship against Portlaoise. Kilkenny Champions James Stephens bridged a 23 year gap when beating Club championships specialists Athenry(Galway) to take the Club Hurling title and the ‘Tommy Moore Cup’.
- ◆ In hurling London became the inaugural winners of the ‘Nicky Rackard Cup’, Westmeath the inaugural winners of the ‘Cristy Ring Cup’, and Tipperary won the ‘Tommy Murphy Cup’ in football- all finals were played in Croke Park.
- ◆ Down won the All Ireland Minor football final ‘Tom Markham Cup’ against Mayo, which was the first ever final between two beaten Provincial finalists. Galway won their second minor hurling final(Irish Press Cup) in a row against Limerick. Galway won the All Ireland U-21 Finals in both Hurling and Football against Kilkenny and Down respectively.
- ◆ Sligo I.T. won their third Sigerson title in four years. In the final it was a case of energetic endeavour rather than flowing football as S.I.T steered their way to a 0-10 to 0-7 points win a.e.t against Queens. Limerick I.T. won their first ever Fitzgibbon Cup against University of Limerick.
- ◆ Knockbeg College (Leinster) won the Colleges ‘A’ All Ireland Final(Hogan Cup) and St Flannans College won the Colleges Hurling ‘A’ Final.

Provincial 2005.

- ◆ Galway won the Connacht SFC title(Nestor Cup), also the Connaught U-21 Title and the Connaught Minor title, and Sligo won the Connaught Junior Football title.
- ◆ Sligo Ladies reached the All Ireland JFC Final where they played some scintillating football in Croke Park, but could not overcome a more experienced and physical Armagh Team.
- ◆ Salthill Knocknacarra won the Connaught Senior Club football final for 2005 against St Brigids of Roscommon.

County 2005.

- ♦ Sligo senior footballers were relegated to Div 2 in the NFL after winning one game, and lost to Leitrim in the Connacht Championship, but restored pride in the County by reaching the fourth round in the Qualifier series before losing to Cork in Portlaoise.
- ♦ Sligo Senior Hurlers were relegated from Div 2, and competed in the new Nicky Rackard All Ireland competition and also the Knock Airport League..
- ♦ Sligo U-21 football team put in a fine performance against eventual winners Galway in the Connacht Championship.
- ♦ Sligo Ladies won the Connaught Junior Championship and went on to contest the Final in Croke Park against a strong Armagh Team.

County Sligo is fortunate to have one of the most efficient and dynamic Cumann na mBunscoil organisations in the Country. Congratulations to all the teachers involved on their dedication. The Club should play a more positive role in helping out the National Schools in our area.

This years I.N.T.O. GAA Mini-Sevens proved once again that the standard of girls Gaelic football in the Country's Primary Schools continues to rise. Amazing progress has been made in a short number of years. It is surely just a matter of time before many more Counties make the break through at Senior level. We must acknowledge the tremendous work being done by Primary Teachers through out the Country. It is particularly pleasing that boys and girls now participate in Gaelic Games on an equal basis. Thousands more girls are playing this great game in Schools and Clubs around the Country. Congratulations to our local NS on the following achievements:-

- ♦ INTO Mini 7's Competition 2005- Boys winners Calry NS.
- ♦ Mini 7's Hurling – runners up were Calry NS.
- ♦ 6/7 Teacher "Salon 2" football runners up – St Brendans NS.
- ♦ St Brendans NS who were the overall winners in the "Fair Play Award".

The Sligo Cumann na mBunscoil won the coveted "National Roadstone Award" for their Football development Project which was presented by An Taoiseach, in the Berkley Court Hotel Dublin. They also received the runners up award for their Fixtures Booklet project.

The **Fair Play award** was introduced to encourage fair play on and off the pitch. It is a much coveted award and selection is achieved by voting after each stage of the competition. The overall winner in 2005 was St Brendans NS -Cartron.

Catch and Kick.

The Mc Donalds Catch & Kick competitions, introduced nationwide in 2003, was continued in 2005 and enthusiastically received in the Primary Schools of Sligo. Boys and girls were allowed to test themselves in some basic skills, and to compete against pairs of children from other schools in the County. The competitions were organised by GPO's Pat Kilcoyne and Gerry Mc Manus.

As a club we need to play a more active role in providing coaching to the Schools in our area.

Finally I want to thank Cumann na mBunscoil and especially the teachers in our local National Schools for their dedication, commitment and hard work in preparing and organising School Teams, boys and girls, hurling and football for the Cumann na mBunscoil competitions.

Club Development Workshop.

There was a very informative and insightful Club Comhairle Planning Course given by the Connaught Council in Nov 05 in the North Side Centre.—John Clifford the County Development Officer and Eamonn Mullin were the Course organisers.. The strength and weakness as perceived by the Club Members were outlined and discussed. Club Manual.

The new Club Manual was launched in Nov 05 and is a most comprehensive publication. It will help to guide GAA clubs well into the future and is a guide to club management , coaching and development. The manual contains a mine of information in relation to all topics that are of interest to clubs. It carries answers to all the usual administrative queries about registration, insurance, roles of club officers, code of conduct for GAA officials, fundraising and many more.

International rules Series 2005.

The Irish team failed to match the more physical and fitter and point scoring ability of the Australian players in both Coca Cola International rules games played in Australia. The manner of winning the ‘Cormac Mc Anallen Cup’ by the Aussies left a lot to be desired. If the type of play was acceptable to the Aussie Officials and players then the future of the series could be in trouble.

The Shinty International between Ireland and Scotland has been a wonderful addition as it allows the best exponents of the small ball game to wear the Irish Jersey. Club player Michael Gilmartin was selected and played for the Ireland U-21 Shinty International V Scotland.

Underage Strategic Plan.

The underage Strategic Plan is a National Coaching Template that has been developed by GAA Head of Games Pat Daly, in conjunction with the National Coaching and Games Development Committee, to develop our National Games into the New Millennium. The objectives are to maximise participation and maintain optimum playing standards. The Plan will be jointly funded by the GAA Units:, National, Provincial, County and Club. The Club will have the responsibility to provide certified Coaches to help run initiatives alongside Teachers and Games Promotion Officers(GPO). The Irish Sports Council and the Sports Council of Northern Ireland are partners in this venture, and the plan is being jointly funded through equipment, gear and grants. There are many initiatives through which the plan can be progressed:-Coaching sessions, skills awards, club mini leagues, Inter club blitzes and many more. John Tobin is helping to co-ordinate as GPO for Connaught. This is a tremendous investment by the GAA and The Sports Council to promote our National Games and as a club we have a key role to play.

Recreational Development in Sligo City.

Sligo Borough Council has completed the development of Kevinsfort Recreation area which consists, among other amenities, a full size sand carpet grass GAA Pitch. The Borough Council also have commenced the development work of two small size pitches at Forthill and are commencing a big development Clevereagh. As a Club which requires more ground we need to make adequate representation and application for shared use in any Park Development within the Club area.

Sligo Sports and Recreation Partnership.

The Irish Sports Council Strategy Document:- ‘A new era for Sport 2000/2002’, has as one of its priorities the fostering and supporting of Innovative Local Sports Partnerships designed to co-ordinate and promote the development of Sport. The Sligo Sport and Recreation Partnership is acting as a consultative forum and represents the views of all local groups. There is funding available for Volunteer Training/Education and development of club and community sport, and other activities. We need to be continuously aware of the funding agencies and avail of any help that maybe available.

Hurling.

It was a historic year for hurling, in which all counties hurled in the summer for the first time ever, thanks to the new three tier championship. And what a championship it turned out to be, graced by two of the finest semi-finals you’ll ever see. Clare almost pipped reigning champions Cork in a magnificent Croke Park encounter, but that match was arguably eclipsed by the one that followed it, the Kilkenny / Galway encounter that some are calling the greatest game ever. The Nicky Rackard Cup for the 3rd tier hurling Counties was won by London against Louth in Croke Park. The Cristy Ring Cup for the 2nd tier hurling Counties was won by Westmeath against Down in Croke Park.

Sligo Ladies Football.

Well done to the Sligo Ladies Gaelic Team on winning the Connaught JFC title for the 2nd year in a row, and on reaching the All-Ireland Final. In a very exciting All- Ireland Final at Croke Park, they lost to a stronger Armagh team, after giving an excellent performance. Congratulations to all involved, particularly the players and the manager Kathleen Kane. Best wishes to new manager Paurick Mannion.

Marchievicz Park.

The Golden Jubilee of the official opening of Marchievicz in 1955 was celebrated at a wonderful Banquet in the Radisson Hotel on 25th Nov 05. This was a very successful fundraising Banquet attended by close on six hundred patrons with special guests:- GAA President elect Nicky Brennan, Connacht Council President Tommy Moran, and legendry Galway hurler Joe Connolly who gave a powerful "Liam Mc Carthy Cup" acceptance speech as gaeige in 1980.

Ocean FM had conducted a poll among its listeners and the following were the worthy winners:- Mickey Kearins was voted the best Sligo player to grace the park since its opening, the late Sean Purcell from Galway as the best player from other Counties, and the 1975 Sligo Team for the famous win over Galway as the most memorable occasion.

There was also a presentation made to Nancy Mc Loughlin on behalf of the late Hugh Mc Loughlin who spent many hours working and giving solid advice on the Park development over the years.

Work has commenced on the construction of new terracing and ancillary facilities at the town end of Marchievicz Park. The planning for the new training ground continues at Ransboro. This will be developed jointly by the County Board and the Coolera/Strandhill Club, and is urgently needed for all the County team's training.

Disputes Resolution Authority.(DRA).

The Disputes Resolution Authority was established by Congress in 2005. The DRA is independent of the GAA and maintains a panel of arbitrators from which it establishes arbitration Tribunals to deal with disputes referred to it. Any party to a dispute (individual or club) governed by the code must submit to the DRA a written request for dispute resolution proceedings. This request must contain confirmation that all avenues of appeal under the Official Guide have been exhausted and a statement that the contents of the claims are true and accurate.

Marty Duffy R.I.P.

In early October 05 the GAA community all around the county was shocked at the sudden and untimely death of Marty Duffy from Rathlee Easkey. Marty was Asst Sec of the County Board, Sec of Games Activities Committee, and Sec of the West Div Board at the time of his death. He was also a former Sec of his beloved Easkey Club and a former PRO of the Sligo County Board. Marty was genial, good humoured, reliable and always helpful. He was hard working and meticulous. He was fair and impartial in his dealings with all clubs. It was fitting that his Club Easkey along with all West Div clubs organised a special fundraising event in the Benbulbin Hotel, Enniscrone in his honour on Dec 17th 05. Special thanks to club members who attended the function and to those who sold and purchased tickets.

Gaelic Telecom.

The Gaelic Telecom initiative was launched by the GAA at National level and was then launched in Sligo in 2005. An tUachtarán Sean O Cheallaigh said at the National launch:- "by joining Gaelic Telecom, every home and business in the country can reduce their monthly telephone bill while supporting their chosen clubs and or county with every call they make. I believe this is a tremendous opportunity for GAA clubs to generate perpetual revenue, risk free and at no cost to members and supporters". The club is grateful for the members – householders and business's who have joined and are contributing in a tangible and positive way to the promotion of the club.

Coaching.

The County Board, in conjunction with Cumann na mBunscoil, Connacht Council, Sligo I.T., and the Clubs put together a comprehensive coaching plan to make coaching available to every primary school in the County in the period February to May 2005. The National Schools in the Club area received the Coaching which was the brainchild of the City Board and has been in operation for the last three years.

Club School liaison Officers will play a very important role in the effective delivery of this coaching project through their links with the Schools.

The 3 National Schools in the Club area received coaching from early Feb 05 for twelve weeks. This Coaching Project was coordinated by County Coaching Committee, Cumann na mBunscoil, and Connacht Council –John Tobin- with the Coaches from the Sligo I.T., who are students doing Sports and Recreational Courses. These coaches were on work placement and received some payment. Roddy Gaynor and Eimear Ward are their tutors, and they carried out the coaching in a dedicated and enjoyable manner. The funding was provided by the Clubs, County Board and Connaught Council. St Patrick's Calry, St Brendan's and St Edwards received this coaching.

There are major developments underway in the Sligo GAA Coaching sphere. A full time County coaching and games development Administrator is about to be appointed for the County.

The "Go Games" were launched by the GAA at a National level in Sept 05, and subsequently in Sligo by John Clifford- County Development Officer, and Eamonn Mullen Cumann na mBunscoil and Connacht Council Official. The "Go Games" provide an excellent opportunity to develop the skills of hurling and gaelic football in an environment where children are afforded the chance to progress at a rate that suits them, and are involved in games that meet their competitive and developmental needs. The health benefits of these small sided games cannot be over emphasised, and recent research underlines this.

There was also a County Coaching calendar produced for 2006.

It is a **requirement** that all Team Managers and Coaches in charge of both underage and adult panels, should have completed a **Foundation Coaching Course**. It is also recommended that a Level 1 Course, which is the next progression after Foundation Level be taken. By undertaking the Coaching a uniform method of coaching and playing will evolve.

Coaching and help at team organisation, school Leagues, and blitz's in the Secondary Schools are receiving assistance from the GPO's.

All Club players should be encouraged to play Gaelic Games for their Colleges. Success at underage County level will only come through players playing competitive College Football.

County U-14 Schools of Excellence and U-15 Development Squads are working to an organised programme geared towards team performance, and offers club players an opportunity to enhance and improve their skills, and raise the standard of Gaelic games.

There are many opportunities for underage players to avail of coaching provided by the Club and County Board:

1. Club Coaching on Saturday mornings during the Gaelic Season-March to September.
2. Coaching from the different Team Managers and Coaches.
3. The AIB Connacht Summer Camps.
4. The City Board Summer Coaching.
5. The Coaching provided by the County Coaching Committee and Cumann na mBunscoil via the Sligo I.T. Students, in the local National Schools.
6. The County U-14, U-15 and U-16 developments squads.
7. Coaching and games provided by Secondary Schools.
8. Girls coaching provided by the Ladies Club Committees.
9. Hurling Coaching provided by the Club Hurling Committee.
10. City Board representative development panels.
11. Cumann na mBunscoil competitions- hurling, football, and Camogie.
12. Inter divisional competitions for U-15 & U17. Give opportunity to play at higher standard.

Importance of Club Membership.

It is vitally important that all people- juveniles and adults –involved in the Club be fully paid up and registered members of the Club for a number of reasons.

1. Players or Officials will not be covered by Insurance unless they are fully paid up members.
2. Players are not legally entitled to play for a team unless they are fully paid up members.
3. Opposing teams can object to a player/team who is not a Registered Full Member.
4. The Club and/or other teams can be suspended if found guilty of playing an un registered player.
5. All Club supporters should be Registered Members if only to demonstrate their support of the Club.
6. The new proposed All Ireland Ticket Allocation will be based on the number of Club Members.
7. Club membership demonstrates the strength and support for a Club.

Team Management responsibilities adult & underage.

1. Ensure all players, trainers, and coaches are **fully paid up members** of the Club.
2. Ensure small **goalposts are secured**, and locked after each training session, and match.
3. Managers should undertake a **Coaching Course and a First Aid course**.
4. Ensure **First Aid kits are available** at all games and training sessions.
5. Please notify **Pitch and Dressing Room Co-ordinator** prior to each game.
6. Organise consistent and meaningful training sessions.
7. **Permission to be sought** from County Secretary **for challenge games** within Sligo, from Connacht Council for matches outside Sligo and within Connacht, and from Central Council for games outside the Province.
8. In the event of an injury to a player the **Preliminary accident Notification Form** should be filled even where the injury is just for Physio treatment.
9. **Match reports** to be forwarded to **Club PRO** for publication in the weekly Club notes.
10. Assist in the **distribution of Club Lotto tickets** for sale by the Team.

11. Keep match details, to help at writing up team reports for the Secretaries Report at the AGM.
12. Help out in City Board & County representative teams and encourage players to participate.
13. Ensure that Club disciplinary Code is adhered with.
14. Ensure large nets behind goals are pulled back and properly tied back after each game / training session.

15. At least one member of each underage management team should attend the **Bord na nOg meetings**.

U-17 & U-15 Divisional Teams.

The Inter Divisional competition, set up by the County Development Committee along with Club representatives, took place in Dec 2005.

This competition is to give meaningful games to interested players, and help to bring them closer to County standard. There are plans to further expand the Inter Divisional Competitions to U-13 and more. This activity will give a more meaningful and positive role to the Divisional Boards. I want to thank Club Member Declan Caslin and his Company Bord na Mona for sponsoring the Jerseys for the North Division Team.

Summerhill College 2005.

Colleges football provides players with an opportunity to play football outside the confines of their clubs. It gives them a perception of Inter County football from the ages of 13 to 17 yrs. It is football in a wider context, and it bypasses the insularity of Club Football. Of course it is a two way street:- the Colleges benefit, and so do the Clubs and County.

This season there are four teams at 1st yr, 2nd yr, Junior and Senior. There were First Year Blitz's held. Second Year are playing in League and Championship. The Junior team are competing well and have great potential. The Senior team were beaten in the 'B' Connacht Colleges semi final and have qualified for the 'A' quarter finals.

The two new pitches at the College are levelled and should be available for use in 2007 and this should help College football development and the local Clubs.

. In the meantime the College are very grateful for the use of St Johns, St Marys, St Molaise Gaels, and Mitchell/Curley Park, and Marchevicz for training and playing games.

A new 2nd level Schools Committee was formed in the County in 2005 under the chairmanship of John Clifford and runai Eamonn Bruen. One of the aims of the committee is to organise support structures and finance for coaching in the Schools. The club is thankful to Fergus Horan who is helping out at coaching in Summerhill College.

It is important, that we as a Club and also parents, encourage players to play with the College Teams, and to help in any way our Second Level Schools in the promotion of Gaelic Games. The teachers who give of their time to organise the playing of the games deserve our thanks.

Sligo I.T.

The success of Sligo I.T. senior footballers in winning the coveted Sigerson Cup for the third time in four years is a great achievement in the competitive world of Third Level College Football. Congratulations to the players, Michael Breslin, Michael Harte, Liam Heekin, and Team manager Kieran Gallagher, and all associated with the GAA Club in the Institute. Sligo I.T. continues to work hard in the promotion of Gaelic Games. It is also very encouraging to see a Club player, Fergus Horan, on the winning Senior Team. The Sligo I.T team are now competing in the Connaught FBD League. Best wishes to the Senior Team and club player Stephen Heraughty, as they compete in the prestigious Sigerson Cup competition in March 2006.

Bord na nOg

Bord na nOg is a vital organ of the club in the promotion and development of Gaelic games. I want to thank the officers and members of Bord na nOg for their dedication and hard work during the year. A highlight of 2005 for the underage was the attendance by the president Sean Kelly at the Bord na nOg AGM in January. I want to congratulate them on all the training sessions organised, games played and their success on the field of play.

SCOR na nOG:

Well done to all involved in the running of the Scor na nOg competition within the Club. It was great to see so much talent coming from The St Edwards school. The Club was well represented in at the North Board Scor na nOg Finals in Drumcliff. I want to congratulate all participants and all who took it upon themselves to organise teams for participation in Scor. It is important to ensure that the promotion of Irish language and culture are promoted at all levels within the Club. Also sincere thanks to the parents for encouraging their children to participate in Scor na nOg. Thank you to Mairead Gonley for all your work in organising Scor participants.

We advise all players (Juvenile and adults) and club officials to have Health Insurance cover eg. VHI, BUPA etc. before they partake in any sporting event. It is every individual's responsibility to ensure they have adequate health/injury insurance since injury is an inherent part of sport. Players need to assume responsibility for their own wellbeing, insure themselves properly and administer their own injury claims through their own health care provider. Thanks to Mary O'Reilly for organising claim forms for injured players during the year.

REFEREES:

The Referee plays a key role on the field of play and must be treated with respect. We should all be prepared to play our part in achieving better quality refereeing by: - changing attitudes towards referees and refereeing; creating the right conditions for referees to carry out their duties; promoting respect for referees and the rules and desisting from abusing referees at all times. The County Board are seeking new referees and I would urge all members to encourage and support any club person who might be interested in taking up refereeing. Well done to John Griffen and Pat McDermott who are newly active in this area.

PITCH USAGE:

The co-ordination of the pitch usage is a very challenging and demanding task with the ever-increasing activity. Thanks to Geraldine Flanagan for all her work in ensuring the pitch properly utilised during the year. All managers must ensure they liaise at an early stage with the Co-ordinator in determining the times and days of training sessions and games.

FINANCE:

The cost of running a club is continuing to increase. Money is needed to keep the club going, to buy equipment, to cover transport, to maintain the grounds, to pay insurance and in general to service the day-to-day needs of the club.

It is important that all Club expenses are pre-approved before they are incurred. If a club member intends to incur an expense or bill the club for any expenses the amount must be approved at a club meeting in advance.

Lotto and fundraising:

The Club LOTTO is our main source of fund-raising and I want to compliment and thank Tim Hynes and all on the Lotto Committee who work tirelessly to support the Club Lotto. Many thanks to all who sold Lotto tickets during the year or who helped with fundraising in any way.

Well done and thank you to Henry Cox, Marcey Coyne, Ger Reilly, Brendan Kelly, Sheila Devaney, Rory Leahy and all the other helpers who put in a huge amount of work in organising the very successful "Who wants to be a Thousandaire event". This was a very professionally organised event as was evident on the night when everything ran like clockwork.

Well done to James Flanagan who won €1,500 for the club in an Ocean FM AIB competition.

As in 2004 we will be selling our own **yearly lotto tickets** and we would urge all members and supporters to continue their support for this. The tickets will cost €30 and will ensure your numbers are entered in all Club Lotto draws for one year (17 draws).

INTERMEDIATE TEAM

2005 can go down on record as an extremely successful year for our Senior – Intermediate, players, managers and supporters.

Following on from our tremendous Intermediate Championship win in 2004 the year started on a high note as we prepared for the Intermediate Connacht Championship semi-final against our neighbours Dromahair having already accounted for Mayo champions Breaffy with an away victory in early December.

Training commenced on January 3rd and we trained on six occasions in January. We played a challenge game against Owenmore Gaels on the 8th January and on 15th January in a thrilling game in Markievicz we defeated Dromahair after extra time on a score line of 1-15 to 1-9 to advance to the Connacht Intermediate Club Final. However this young team can be very proud of their efforts. Overall our journey in Connacht was a great experience for players management and supporters. After nearly two years of continuous training and matches we took a break from training for the month of February as a number of our panel were preparing for the U-21 Club championship.

We re-convened with a well attended players meeting at the end of February in Hazelwood. Targets were set for the year. To win the Intermediate league was the number one priority, to try and win the Benson Cup for the first time and to advance as far as possible in the Senior championship.

As a follow up to this meeting training commenced on the 5th March. We played our first game on 12th March in the Benson Cup v St Johns. Our year ended on the 20th November with victory in the Benson Cup final against Cloonnacool in Ballymote on a scoreline of 1-10 to 0-3. We had a total of 76 training sessions, 14 league games, 4 senior championship games, 4 Benson Cup games, 2 Connacht club games and also challenge games, one of these being hosts to Dublin Club St Perrigins on the 20th August.

What a year it proved to be in terms of success. We won 11 of our 13 league games, which ensured our place in the Division 2 league final. We proved we were the best team in this division with victory over St Farnans in the league final on a score line of 0-8 to 1-2 at Markievicz Park on 23rd October which meant we returned as worthy champions to play Senior League football in 2006.

In our third c'ship game we played Bunninadden on the 14th August in Markievicz Park and our performance never reached the same levels as our previous two games. We lost on a scoreline of 0-6 to 1-9. Despite the set back our superior score difference secured us a place in the quarter finals. Here we came up against an experienced star studded Curry Team on the 27th August in Markievicz Park. We matched Curry score for score for three quarters of the game but in the final quarter their strength and experience proved too much for our brave efforts and they ended up winning on a score line of 1-20 to 1-10. The team can be very proud of their progress in their first year in the Senior C'ship. We ended off the year on a high note when we won the Benson Cup as mentioned earlier for the first time in the history of the club.

They had been beaten in the last four county finals, but turned the tables on the champions of the past ten years, Tubbercurry, in a pulsating '05 decider at Kent Park on October 16.

The 1-11 to 2-6 winners played with unbelievable conviction throughout and took the decision with injury time points from Michael Gilmartin and Michael Shelley.

Tubber had to play most of the second half with 14 men after the dismissal of goalkeeper Michael Gorman for an off-the-ball incident.

But there were no complaints audible from the Calry camp, as Shane Boyd became the first man from the club to receive the Sligo SHC cup.

Though these reports only mention a few names it was a team effort all year from Eamon Lonergan in goals to our youngest players such as Niall Caheny and David Cox to the more established to many to name to our great support staff of Marcia Coyne and Margaret Raymond. A Team Effort.

After some celebrations the club played St Mary's, Leitrim champions at Carrick on Shannon the following Saturday in the first round of the Connacht Championship. The team bore no resemblance to the one which had triumph a week earlier as five players had to return to college abroad and with Eamon Lonergan travelling to Russia for his charity work, the game was a thrilling encounter, made more memorable for the return of Henry Cox to our goals but it wasn't enough to stop us going down by 4 points, 1-17 to 2-10.

The icing on the cake arrived in early December when after five weeks of inactivity the club went out to Tourlestrane to play the Dermott Molloy League Final and despite having the bare minimum of personnel

available triumphed on a score line of 3-14 to 0-8. So for the first time since Craobh Rua in 1993 Sligo had County and League Champions from the one club. The link between both triumphs is Uisce Watters, Tony Gallagher, Michael Galvin Henry Cox and Stephen Whelan while Dara Cox was a mascot then alongside John Galvin in '92.

At this juncture, I have to bring up the only negative from our triumph was the non availability of Markievicz Park for the County final and the lame excuses given by the park committee to stop the most important hurling match in the Sligo hurling calendar from been played in its rightful venue. This is further brought into context when one considers that there were only two senior hurling matches played at the venue in 2005. It was a disgraceful decision when taken into context that Croke Park will be opening its doors to Soccer and Rugby yet Markievicz Park committee wouldn't open up its gates to Hurling.

PRO Report

The adoption of new GAA Membership procedures at the recent Special Congress could lead to a fairer allocation of tickets for All Ireland Finals. Currently the screen is not visible to those on Hill 16 and a second screen is being installed at the Canal End, to be ready for the Club Finals on March 17th 06.

The Club.

No matter how successful it becomes or how magnificent its head quarters, the beating heart of the GAA will always be its local clubs. In a dark time the GAA Club was a little shaft of light, a leavening of existence. The Club – they take you there, holding your hand for comfort because you are barely weaned. They insert you into the hurly burly of mini –leagues. They watch you sink or swim. So it begins. And when the final whistle shrills for you, when they lower you down, you'll be flanked by a guard of honour wearing the colours you have always loved. And maybe they'll throw in your old jersey to keep you warm for eternity. So it ends.

The GAA Club. There is nothing like it elsewhere in Irish life, no other reliable well of social capital and local pride. No greater passion machine. There is no GAA without the Club. No kids coming through. No superstars holding their hands out. No distinctive local culture. No mentors, no administrators. Without the network of GAA clubs there would be less of everything in Irish life. In modern day Ireland we are compartmentalised and closed off. People don't come together anymore. We aren't cheek to jowl, accepting each other as we once were, except in GAA Clubs. You have your row over an overheard slight, a dropped son or daughter, a dirty pull, a bad tackle and so on. That's life as it's supposed to be lived. You have your differences but you don't isolate yourself in your semi-detached shell. Clubs are the lungs of a place. When a community is healthy the Club grows. GAA club life breaks an ordinary existence up into years and divides years into seasons, and renders fixtures lists out of seasons. Ordinary men and women whose lives would be otherwise unremarkable blossom within clubs. If you can't play that well you can mentor, you can administrate, you can become the rules expert, you can find some way of belonging and helping out.

The ESRI report on looking at the impact of sport in Ireland singled out the GAA for its unique contribution and called it one of the "great generators of social capital in Ireland". With its traditionally large share of volunteering, membership of clubs, attendance at events and popularity throughout the country, the GAA was lauded as a model of what the voluntary, community –based sports organisation can contribute to society.
