The quota for election is the next highest number of the total number of votes divided by the number of vacancies plus one. In the cases of one vacancy to be filled on the single votes of 90 full members, the quota would be 46.
- (3) All motions must be formally proposed and seconded.
- (4) The proposer of the motion must do so in less than three minutes but will have the right of reply for two minutes at the end of the discussion.
- (5) No member other than the proposer may speak more than once on any motion.
- (6) All speakers, other than the proposer of a motion, must limit themselves to two minutes.
- (7) Members are requested to sign in on entering the AGM hall.

## SENIOR TEAM REPORT

2007 can be regarded as a year of mixed fortunes with some good results and some disappointments. However our young team has gained a lot of experience in league and championship and we are certainly closing the gap on the stronger senior teams.

It is encouraging that we have maintained our senior status in league and championship and we introduced a number of younger players to strengthen our senior panel.

Our season began with a well attended players meeting in Hazelwood on 13-1-07 and we had our first training session on 3-2-07. Our first competitive game was away to St. Farnans in the Kiernan cup on the 25-2-07 and our last game was played on the 9-9-07 a senior championship quarter final versus Easkey.

We had a total of 62 training sessions, 13 league matches, 3 senior championship games, 3 Kiernan Cup games and 2 challenge matches.

Our league division was made up of 8 teams St. John's, Drumcliffe /Rosses Point, St. Fernans, Tubbercurry, Enniscrone, Calry/ St.Joseph's, Coolera/ Strandhill and Shamrock Gales and it proved to be a very competitive division.

Out of 13 matches played, we won 5 and drew 3, giving us a total of 13 points and our last game against Tubbercurry was not played as relegation and promotion was decided at that stage.

In the Senior Championship we were drawn in a group of 3 teams Bunninadden, Tourlestrane and Calry / St. Joesphs. On Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> July we played 2006 county finalist Bunninadden in Markievzc Park and we turned in a great performance to win impressively on a score- line of 2-9 to 0-11. Our next match was against the eventual winners Tourlestrane on September 1<sup>st</sup> in Ballymote and the team put in a tremendous effort and matched Tourlestrane all over the field for lengthy periods and the final score- line of 4-8 to 0-9 was not a true reflection of our efforts. We finished second in the group and this set us up for a quarter final clash with Easkey in Tubbercurry on the 9<sup>th</sup> of September. Despite being seriously restricted due to the loss of three or four key players through injury and the paint on the post prevented us from snatching victory to loose narrowly on a score-line of 0-11 to 0-9.

On behalf of the team management we would like to thank the players for their attitude and commitment and as always this team has a tremendous fighting spirit and a never say die attitude.

We would like to thank the loyal supporters and our club executive for their great support at all times our physio's Gerry Higgins & Breege Scanlon for their great work throughout the year also Gearldine and Patrick Flannagan pitch and dressing room co-ordinators, also Pauric O' Connor and our loyal P.R.O. Gary Dillon and everybody else who helped us throughout the year. A special thanks in particular to A.Maguire who took many enjoyable training sessions and Donnacha Mullin and Eamon Kelly who helped with training. We thanks our sponsors in 2007 Declan Caslin, Bord na Mona, Stephen Devaney, Heatmerchants and Gerry Nicholson, Connolly's Bar and John Keane Meats and hope they will continue their support in 2008.

We congratulate Fergus Horan on being part of the Sligo Connacht wining championship team and he played his first league match against Cavan on the 10<sup>th</sup> March, also Keith Raymond U-21 county player and Brian O' Reilly and Stefan Callaghan Co minor players. Congratulations to our senior hurlers who include a number of dual players on winning the senior hurling championship.

On a final note I am stepping down from my position as senior team manager after 5 yrs. We all had some great times together both on and off the field and one of my abiding memories was the passionate speech from the heart by the late Hugh Mc Loughlin in the Village Inn on the night we won the championship in 2004, a few weeks before he passed away, moments like this make it all worthwhile.

A lot of progress has been made in that 5 yrs giving tremendous satisfaction to have won the Benson Cup Intermediate League & Championship and reaching the Connacht Intermediate Club Final. I honestly believe there is great potential in this team and I have no doubt that greater success can be achieved and I am very proud of the panel of players that I am handing over to the new management. I wish the new manager A. Mc Cannon and his selectors the best of luck for the future and can assure them my full support at all times.

Finally I would like to thank my 2 fellow selectors Vinny Fowley and Martin Horan for their loyalty support and friendship over the last 5 yrs, also Damian Flynn, Ian Kearins and Colm Devaney for all their help in 2007.

### **Discipline.**

The County Board has appointed a (CCC) Competitions Control Committee, which is responsible for the control and management of any matter arising from games under the jurisdiction of the County Board. Where a breach of rule is brought to the attention of the CCC through referees report or otherwise, the CCC has authority to decide whether or not disciplinary action is warranted. The player or offender can accept the penalty or within three days of receiving the notice can seek a hearing from the Hearings Committee. The Hearing Committee will have no member from County Ex or the CCC. This Hearings committee may deal with all disciplinary matters within the County.

### **Disputes Resolution Authority.(DRA).**

The Disputes Resolution Authority was established by Congress in 2005. The DRA is independent of the GAA and maintains a panel of arbitrators from which it establishes arbitration Tribunals to deal with disputes referred to it. Any party to a dispute (individual or club) governed by the code must submit to the DRA a written request for dispute resolution proceedings. This request must contain confirmation that all avenues of appeal under the Official Guide have been exhausted and a statement that the contents of the claims are true and accurate.

### **Players Insurance Scheme.**

Claims Procedure:- Claim Forms must be completed and signed by the injured member and a declaration as to their authenticity must be signed by the Club Secretary and counter signed by a designated County Officer(Mick Burke). The Claim documentation must incorporate: -

- (1) Coyle Hamilton must be notified within 30 days of the date of the injury.
- (2) The completed Claim Form should be submitted to Coyle Hamilton within a further 30 days
- (3) Forms can be downloaded from the GAA Website.

### **Importance of Club Membership.**

It is vitally important that all people- juveniles and adults –involved in the Club be fully paid up and registered members of the Club for a number of reasons.

1. Insurance.
2. Objections.
3. Suspension of team / club.

### **Team Management responsibilities adult & underage.**

Team Manager to delegate tasks to as many members as possible.

1. Collect membership.
2. Keep small goalposts secured
3. A Coaching Course and a First Aid course should be undertaken.
4. Notify Pitch and Dressing Room Co-ordinator.
5. Team sheets in Irish
6. Organise consistent and meaningful training sessions.
7. Jerseys and team attire is presentable.
8. Good conduct
9. All players should get games
10. Permission to be sought from County Secretary for challenge games within Sligo, from Connacht Council for matches outside Sligo and within Connacht, and from Central Council for games outside the Province.
11. Preliminary accident Notification Form should be filled for all injuries.
12. Match reports sent to PRO.
13. Line out pitch to relevant standard for each home game.
14. Assist in club fundraising
15. Write year end report for AGM
16. Help out in City Board & County representative teams and encourage players to participate.
17. Tie back large nets

Liam Og Gormley the newly appointed Sligo GAA Games Promotions Officer is doing Trojan work and his enthusiasm is having a positive effect on players, teachers and the volunteer coaches who are helping out. John Clifford the County Development Officer is also doing great work in the promotion of Gaelic games.

## **Underage Strategic Plan.**

The objectives are to maximise participation and maintain optimum playing standards. The Club will have the responsibility to provide certified Coaches to help run initiatives alongside Teachers and Games Promotion Officers(GPO). The Irish Sports Council and the Sports Council of Northern Ireland are partners in this venture, and the plan is being jointly funded through equipment, gear and grants. There are many initiatives through which the plan can be progressed:-Coaching sessions, skills awards, club mini leagues, Inter club blitzes and many more. John Tobin is helping to co-ordinate as GPO for Connaught. This is a tremendous investment by the GAA and The Sports Council to promote our National Games and as a club we have a key role to play.

## **Sligo GAA Development Plan 2007-2012.**

During the year the Sligo GAA Development Plan 2007-2012 was launched under the title of ‘‘Moving forward with Sligo’’. This will act as a road map, setting objectives, targets, and strategy on a short and medium term basis as the way forward for Gaelic Games in the County up to 2012. Under the plan Sligo GAA will provide the means to design, encourage, implement and evaluate the procedures to improve our County team performances at all levels in hurling and football. The Plan received a massive initial boost when one of its targets, a Connacht SFC Title within three years, was achieved within three months. This was a wonderful start, but the acid test of the success of the programme will be its satisfactory implementation over the next five years. To achieve its objectives it will need the continued and consistent help and support of the Co Bd, Clubs and everyone involved in Sligo GAA. The Friends of Sligo have a major input along with the County Board and Liam Og Gormley. This plan will be central to the progress of the Sligo GAA over the next few years and the key to its success will be the commitment from all Clubs.

## **County Sligo GAA Coaching Plan 2007-2012.**

The Sligo GAA Coaching Plan 2007-2012 was drawn up during the year by the Sligo Coaching and Games Development Committee under the guidance of Liam Og Gormley along with inputs from all Clubs. The Plan clearly outlines the future development of our coaching structures over the next five years. The Plan is realistic and feasible and aims at improving the enjoyment level of participants through competent and well informed coaching. It further aims at making underage County teams more competitive at all levels. The success of this plan will depend on all Clubs endorsing the principles of coaching and implementing them at all underage team level.

There is also a detailed Coaching CD which demonstrates and explains many coaching skills and techniques. This CD needs to be rolled out to all underage managers and coaches.

### **Sligo GAA Website.**

The Sligo GAA website has been set up during the year. This has been a great development and is set to go from strength to strength in the future. It should be the first port of call for anybody looking for immediate and up to date information about GAA activity in Sligo. [www.sligogaa.ie](http://www.sligogaa.ie)

### **New U-12 Structures.**

2007 saw a radical change in the U-12 structure. The system was developed along the "Go Games" rules and ideals and is intended to provide football for all young children who wish to play at this level. It is recognised at all sporting codes internationally that small sided games at this age group are the way forward if we wish to promote skill development. To this end all games were 9 or 11 a side. This along with "two plays rule", gives players more ball contact, develops a better awareness of team play and reduces the overcrowding on the field, and allows players more time and space to practice their skills in a game situation. There were 3 blitz days held in Marchevicz Park in July 07 and all but two Clubs participated. These blitz's were a huge success providing an opportunity for most of our young players to play in the home of Sligo GAA.

As a Club we should have at least two teams entered in the U-12 Leagues and Blitz's.

### **Multicultural Day pilot theme of `Gaelic For All`**

The Sligo GAA City Board Multicultural Day pilot theme of `Gaelic For All` was hosted in Kevinsfort Curley Mitchell Park on Saturday 5th May 07. Over 30 non national children aged 7 to 13 years attended. The event showcased Gaelic football for boys and girls and hurling for boys.

The St Marys U-12 boys and girls teams and the Naomh Eoin U-12 hurlers together with a number of boys from Carraroe and Calry played exhibition matches. County Development Officers Liam Og Gormley for football and John Mullins for hurling gave an enthusiastic coaching session to the participants. They all joined in for international matches, and seemed to show a particular liking for hurling.

The children were bussed in from St Brendans , St Edwards, Mercy , St Johns , Carraroe and Scoil Ursula National schools and were encouraged by their link language teachers. The event commenced with a hand held circle to signify global unity and a welcome to Ireland and Sligo. All children were presented with a souvenir shirt and Gaelic football as well as refreshments.

The participants included children from Pakistan, Poland ,Phillipines, India, Bangladesh, Kurdistan and Iran. The children are encouraged to join their local clubs and participate in club coaching as well as the City leagues and blitzes and the GAA Summer Camps.

The coaches from Calry , St Johns ,Naomh Eoin and St Marys boys and girls were of great assistance as well as the volunteers from St Marys who arranged to have all the equipment in place for the event. A multilingual volunteer translator Anne Pelletier made communication easier for all.

The event was funded by grant assistance from Sligo Sport and Recreation Partnership who were represented by Sports Coordinator Deirdre Lavin and Director Jim Owens at the event. The grounds were provided by Sligo Corporation. We hope to see these boys and girls integrating into local sport and winning county championships and who knows representing Sligo in future at a bigger stage in Croke Park or even Gaelic Park.

Special thanks to all who helped make this a most enjoyable and sporting occasion- especially the Teachers who promoted the event, the Club coordinators and Cathal O'Donnell who spared no effort to make this very worthwhile event the success it was.

### **Integration and inclusion through GAA.**

It is widely acknowledged that sport and leisure activities provide an important focus for interaction and inclusion. The GAA is currently devising a pilot programme, which aims to introduce GAA to Non – Irish Nationals, based on the "Go Games" concept – where every child plays a game. The "Go Games" promotional material will be available in eight languages. The Programme will start in eight National Schools in Dublin. The children will be coached and their parents encouraged to get involved in Gaelic Games. The Project will then be rolled out Nationally along with appropriate policies and procedures.

Cumann na mBunscoil are playing a huge part in getting children from ethnic backgrounds involved in GAA. They played an International game in Croke Park at half time of the Dublin V Tyrone Allianz NFL Div 1A under lights on 3<sup>rd</sup> Feb 07. Children from 16 different Countries were represented on the night.

### **Bord na nOg.**

Bord na nOg is a vital organ of the Club structure in the promotion and development of Gaelic Games. This Committee deals with the most important area's in relation the underage players and gives a stronger focus and

purpose to the Coaching and development of players from 5 yrs to 18 yrs. There is always a need for more people to get involved and help out the already overworked Team Coaches and Managers.

Bord na nOg should increase the number of underage players and develop the skills required for playing at adult level. Special thanks to all involved in Bord na nOg.

### **Referees.**

The referee plays a key role on the field of play and must be treated with respect. We should all be prepared to play out part in achieving better quality refereeing by:- changing attitudes towards referees, - creating the right conditions for referees to carry out their duties,- promoting respect for referees and the rules and desisting from abusing referees at all times.

The County Board are always looking for referees and there are great Referees Courses held during the year. Club members who have any inclination to become a referee are encouraged to attend these courses and give it a go. Many thanks to our Club Referees who are well respected throughout the County:- John Griffin, Declan O'Boyle, Pat Mc Dermott, and Gerry Higgins.

### **GAA's Alcohol and substance Abuse Prevention Programme.(ASAP).**

The aim of this programme is to reduce the harm which is being done by alcohol and drugs to young people. Every Club is asked to develop a club Drug and Alcohol Policy that is appropriate to its area. An excellent manual has been produced which outlines for GAA Officials and Members , advice and procedures for dealing with drug and alcohol related issues. GAA Clubs should be the places where people find a sense of value and belonging and also safe from the harms of drugs and alcohol.

Martin Giblin (St Patricks Club) has been appointed County Officer for this Programme and all Clubs should actively support this initiative, and appoint a Club Officer to promote this initiative.

### **Gaelic Telecom.**

The Gaelic Telecom initiative was launched by the GAA at National level and was then launched in Sligo in 2005. An tUachtarán Sean O Cheallaigh said at the National launch:- "by joining Gaelic Telecom, every home and business in the country can reduce their monthly telephone bill while supporting their chosen clubs and or county with every call they make. I believe this is a tremendous opportunity for GAA clubs to generate perpetual revenue, risk free and at no cost to members and supporters". The club is grateful for the members – householders and business's who have joined and are contributing in a tangible and positive way to the promotion of the club.

### **Recreational Development in Sligo City.**

Sligo Borough Council has completed the development of Kevinsfort Recreation area which consists, among other amenities, a full size sand carpet grass GAA Pitch. The Borough Council also have commenced the development work of two small size pitches at Forthill and are commencing a big development Clevereagh. As a Club which requires more ground we need to make adequate representation and application for shared use in any Park Development within the Club area.

### **Markievicz Park.**

Phase 9 of the development- extending the stand (3800 seats) is about to commence and Phase 10 the construction of a terrace and toilet block will start early in the new year. The development work is ongoing which is a great tribute to the hard working Park Committee.

### **Programme of Games for Club Players.**

There has been a lot of debate about the issue of a better programme of games for players over the last year. There was a discussion document drawn up by GAA Player Welfare Manager Padraic Duffy and this has highlighted the issue even more. Padraic Duffy has compiled a report that will go before a Special Congress in Jan 2008. Effectively it is an attempt to arrest the ever-increasing amount of inter-county activity at all levels and give a better structured and more predictable timetable of games to club players, who form the vast majority of players in the Association.

### **Player Burnout.**

The Report of the GAA Task Force on player burnout has recently been published. Player "burnout" is defined as reduced or total withdrawal from participation in Gaelic Games as a result of the psychological, physiological, and physical demands associated with excessive training and / or number of games played. The major proposal of the Task Force is the amalgamation of the inter- county minor and U-21 grades into a single grade of under -19 from 2009 on. This and other proposals will be debated at a Special Congress in Jan 2007.

### **GAA Congress 2008.**

The GAA Annual Congress 2008 will be held in County Sligo in the Raddisson Hotel on 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> April 08. This event will bring many visitors to Sligo and is a great honour for the County Board and all the Clubs, and due recognition of the work of the GAA in the County. It will be a very exciting Congress with the election of

the President –elect, the person to succeed Nicky Brenna as Uachtaran CLG at Congress 2009. It will also be the first Congress for the new Ard –Stiurthoir of the Association Padraic Duffy.

### **National 2007.**

- ◆ Kerry became the first team in 17 years to retain the All- Ireland (Sam Maguire) with an easy win over near neighbours Cork. (Their 35<sup>th</sup> Title). Donegal won their first ever National League title against Mayo.
- ◆ Kilkenny won the Guinness All Ireland Senior Hurling Championship (Liam Mc Carthy Cup) with a good win over Limerick. Waterford captured the National Hurling League title in impressive fashion against Kilkenny. Cork Senior Ladies sealed an incredible three in a row All Ireland Senior crowns ( Brendan Martin Cup) against Mayo. Leitrim Ladies won the first Intermediate All Ireland Final (Mary Quinn Cup) against Wexford in a cracking game in Croke Park.
- ◆ Crossmaglen (Armagh) regained the All Ireland Senior Club football championship (Andy Merrigan Cup) against Dr Crokes (Kerry) and secured their fourth title. Ballyhale Shamrocks (Kilkenny) won the Club Hurling title and the “Tommy Moore Cup” with a comfortable victory over Loughrea(Galway).
- ◆ In hurling Roscommon won the “Nicky Rackard Cup”, Westmeath won the “Cristy Ring Cup”, and Wicklow won the “Tommy Murphy Cup” in football- all finals were played in Croke Park.
- ◆ Galway won the All Ireland Minor football final “Tom Markham Cup” and ended a 21 year famine with a sensational victory over luckless Derry. Tipperary won the minor Hurling All Ireland Final (Irish Press Cup) against Cork. Cork won the “Cadbury’s All Ireland U-21 football final against Laois, and Galway won the U-21 All Ireland Hurling final against Dublin.

### **Provincial 2007.**

- ◆ Sligo ended a 32 year Connacht famine when Tommy Breheny’s charges finally struck for redemption on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2007 and won the Connacht SFC title(Nestor Cup). After demolishing New York in the opening round, they ousted a promising Roscommon side in their last four encounter to surge into the Provincial Final against Galway. A superb all – round performance in Dr Hyde Park, spurred on by captain Eamonn O’Hara’s wonder goal late in the first half, saw the men in Black overcome the Tribesmen by a single point, to end the misery and send their fans into delirium. (Sligo 1—10 Galway 0—12). Mayo won the Connaught U-21 Title. Galway won the Connaught Minor title. Leitrim won the Connacht Ladies Intermediate and Mayo Ladies won the senior.
- ◆ Ballina Stephenites (Mayo) won the Connaught Senior Club football final for 2007 against St Brigids (Roscommon)

### **County 2007.**

- ◆ Sligo senior footballers remain in Div 3 of the NFL. They won the Connacht Ch/ip against Galway after a 32 year famine. They were knocked out in the Quarter Finals of the All Ireland Championship against Cork on a score of – Sligo 0—8 Cork 1—11.
- ◆ Sligo Senior Hurlers reached the final of the Allianz League Div 3, and competed in the new Nicky Rackard All Ireland competition and also the Knock Airport League..
- ◆ Sligo Ladies lost the All Ireland U-16 “B” Championship against Clare in Tuam Stadium.

### **An Appreciation – Gerry Dillon (By Tim Hynes).**

It was with great shock and sadness that we learned of the untimely death of Gerry Dillon on Sat 24<sup>th</sup> Nov 07. Gerry was a great clubman and was always eager and available to help out. He was truly one of nature’s gentlemen and was above all good company, a good story teller with a roguish sense of humour. He had a great passion for all things Irish- sport, culture, song, dance and music. He was a proud Sligo man when Sligo won the Connacht championship this year. His company and conversation was always inspiring and lively. Always available to listen and give useful and helpful advice.

His outstanding personal qualities endeared him to his many friends.

The way he bore his illness was a testament to his positive outlook and his immense dignity and courage, and he never burdened anyone with complaints about his illness.
